Whether you are applying to college, pursuing internships, or launching your career, a strong portfolio sets you apart. It shows people what you can do, not just what you say you can do.

Portfolio Setup Checklist

- Choose your platform
- Select a clean, professional template
- Use consistent branding (colors, fonts, headings)
- Add a professional-looking photo or avatar
- Write your "About Me" section
- Organize content into clear sections
- Add contact information (email only -- no home address)
- Test on mobile devices (most viewers will use phones)

Get feedback from a teacher or mentor before sharing

Save the URL somewhere accessible

3. What to Include in Your Portfolio

Section	What Goes Here	Tips
About Me	Personal statement, values, aspirations	Keep it to 150 words. Be authentic.
Academic Work	Best papers, presentations, research	Choose 3-5 pieces. Quality over quantity.
Projects	Personal or group projects, competitions	Include process, not just final product.
Achievements	Awards, honors, certifications	Include context: what, when, why it matters.
Leadership	Clubs, teams, mentoring, community work	Focus on impact: what changed because of you?
Reflections	Growth stories, lessons learned	Shows self-awareness -- highly valued.
Skills	Technical and soft skills	Be specific: "Python" not just "coding."
Contact	Email, LinkedIn, relevant social links	Professional email only. No personal socials.

Best Practices for Presentation

DO	DON'T
Use clear headings and consistent formatting	Overload with too much text
Include visuals (images, graphs, screenshots)	Use low-quality or blurry images
Proofread everything multiple times	Include unfinished or weak work
Update regularly (at least quarterly)	Include personal information (address, phone)
Tell the story behind each piece	Use flashy animations or distracting design

5. LinkedIn & Online Presence

LinkedIn Profile Optimization Checklist

- Professional photo -- clear, well-lit headshot with plain background
- Compelling headline -- not just "Student" but "Aspiring Data Scientist | Math Enthusiast"
- Summary/About section -- 3-5 sentences about who you are, what you do, and where you're going
- Education details -- school, GPA (if strong), relevant coursework
- Experience -- internships, jobs, volunteer work with measurable accomplishments
- Skills section -- add at least 10 relevant skills; ask connections to endorse them
- Projects section -- highlight 2-3 best projects with descriptions
- Recommendations -- request 2-3 recommendations from teachers/mentors
- Custom URL -- change from random characters to linkedin.com/in/yourname
- Activity -- like, comment, and share posts related to your field of interest

7. Interview Preparation Guide

The STAR Method for Answering Questions

Step	What to Do
S -- Situation	Describe the context. Where were you? What was happening?
T -- Task	What was your responsibility or goal?
A -- Action	What specific steps did you take?
R -- Result	What was the outcome? What did you learn?

Common Interview Questions

#	Question	Your Strategy
1	"Tell me about yourself."	Use your elevator pitch!
2	"What's your greatest strength?"	STAR method with evidence
3	"Describe a challenge you overcame."	Use Failure Forensics!
4	"Why are you interested in this opportunity?"	Research + personal connection
5	"Where do you see yourself in 5 years?"	Show ambition + alignment
6	"Do you have any questions for us?"	ALWAYS have 2-3 prepared

Interview Day Checklist

- Research the organization thoroughly
- Prepare 3 STAR stories
- Choose professional attire the night before
- Bring copies of your resume and portfolio URL
- Arrive 10-15 minutes early

- Bring a notebook and pen for notes
- Practice a firm handshake and eye contact
- Send a thank-you email within 24 hours

9. Portfolio Maintenance Schedule

Frequency	Action
After every major project	Add the project using the Project Showcase template
Monthly	Update skills section with new competencies
Quarterly	Review all content, remove outdated pieces, refresh About Me if needed
Before any application	Tailor portfolio for the specific opportunity; check all links work

Annually

Complete redesign review -- does the layout still feel professional and current?

Pro Tip: Keep a "Portfolio Inbox" folder on your computer where you save screenshots, drafts, certificates, and project files throughout the year. When it is time to update your portfolio, everything is already collected.
